

Support Crew Information – 3M3D

Support crews are neither required nor necessary as the checkpoints provide competitors with sufficient access to their race needs. If you do choose to have a support crew, they are permitted to assist runners anywhere along the course where vehicle access is available.

The support crew is responsible for obtaining their own maps and directions to the various locations. Please do some forward planning in this regard – do not bother the race director, finish line manager, checkpoint marshals or volunteers on race day with questions on how to navigate around the course. Obey all road rules. Watch out for runners on the road – the roads are often narrow and windy.

Where can support crew vehicles NOT go?

Marathon 1:

- Between Wright's Lookout and Smith's Track Checkpoint (at the end of Stoney Creek Road)
- Snake Gully Track (between Speewah and Clohesy River Road)
- Clohesy River Road (from the locked gate leading down to the dam)

Marathon 2 / Fig Tree races:

- From the dam wall to the locked gate on Clohesy River Road
- Viviers Track
- From the gate on the one end of Bridle Creek Road to the gate on the other end.

Marathon 3 / Cairns Marathon / Lake Morris Road Race:

- Lake Morris Road (from the first lookout to Copperlode Dam. Road is closed from 8.00am to 2.00pm.

Finish Line at Copperlode Dam on Saturday

Please note that there is very limited parking at Copperlode Dam. Competitors, support crew, volunteers and spectators MUST abide to the following conditions:

DO NOT PARK your vehicle in top car park at the dam. It is a local park used by the community. The top parking area is reserved for other park users.

If you are driving up to the dam, please ride share. Drive past the first car park you will come to and continue around the u-bend to the carpark at the lower level.

Finish Line at Goomboora Park

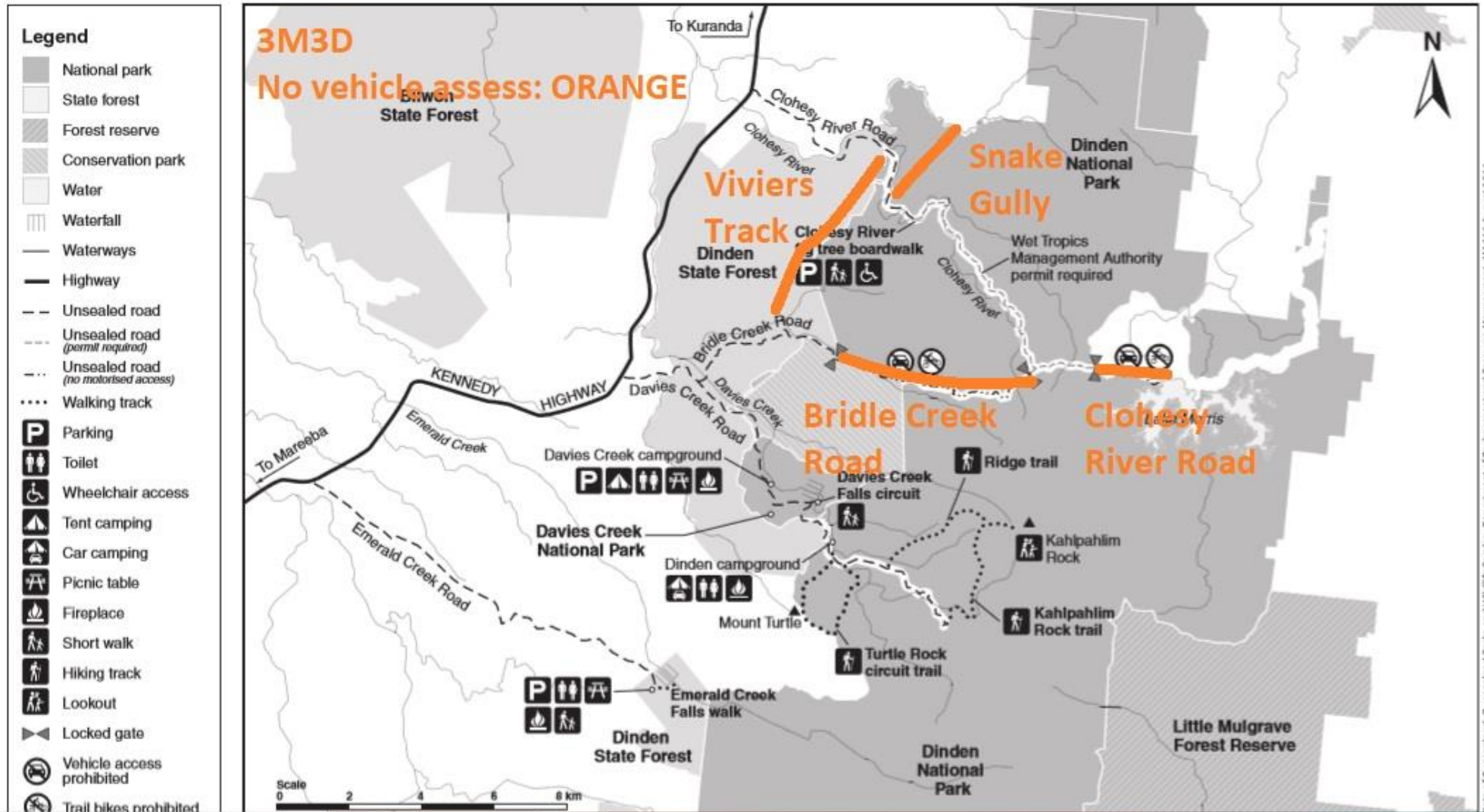
Please note that there is very limited parking at Goomboora Park. Competitors, support crew, volunteers and spectators MUST abide to the following conditions:

DO NOT PARK your vehicle in Goomboora Park itself. It is a local park used by the community. There is also a dog walking area, and those parking spots must remain open for those park users.

Try to share a ride where possible. **Park on the streets surrounding Goomboora Park, without obstructing the local residents' driveways.**
